The first mention of any Harlows in North America began with Captain Edward Harlow who sailed with Captain John Smith. They explored the New England coast and down around Virginia.

In 1609 Peter Harlow was a member of the Virginia Company, but he probably died during The Starving Times. In 1622, John Harlow was living at Elizabeth City(now Hampton). He came over on the Sampson in 1619 at the age of 28. Anthony Harlow was living on James Island at the same time.

I feel the John Harlow who arrived in 1619, later moved to Warwick County(now Newport News). He became Commissioner of Warwick around 1647-48. John served in the House of Burgesses in 1658-59. He married Alice Weeks, widow of James Weeks prior to 1663.

There was a court case concerning some property which had been sold to Matthew Fares(Paris) by James Weeks before he died. John Harlow felt that James Weeks had not sold him the property(records are missing on who won).

John and Alice Harlow owned 550 acres of land, but only Alice Harlow is mentioned in the Warwick tithes in 1686, so John must have died by then between 80-90(not unususal for a Harlow).

The second John Harlow came over in May 21, 1635 bringing his whole family; wife Ann, son Stephen, daughter Mary, sister Aguis and two others as servants--Matthew Peake and Wm. Cale. In 1663 Robert Peake brings over Edward Harlow. In the 17th century they had a very loose definition of servants--they could be orphan relatives(see Domestic Life in Virginia in the 17th Century by Annie Jester).

Another daughter, Elizabeth, mentioned as John Harlow's daughter in William Smith's will. William's will was executed in Accomac in 1636. It is possible that the Mary above was called Mary Elizabeth and he used her middle

name in his will.

John Harlow owned 400-500 acres in Accomac and Northampton. He left a will in Northampton in 1651.

His only son Stephen, got 200 acres of the land and in 1667, Stephen and his wife Susannah sold their share to Provost Nelson, who had married his widowed mother, Ann.

They, Stephen and Susannah, apparently moved out of the county, but in 1674, James Harlow is recorded in Accomac's Book of Certificates and Rights. It is believed he is the same James Harlow who was in Chowan, N. C. between 1693-1744. The name Stephen reappears in N. C. in the 1740's but is never again mentioned in early Virginia records.

The third John Harlow lived in Surry County in 1668. He was a boatwright and married widow Mary Hux, former wife of Wm. Hux. The court records state he promised to pay her son, when he, John Hux, reaches 21, 1700 lbs. of tobacco, as his share in his deceased father's estate.

The fourth John Harlow was in York county records;

April 14, 1646 Richard Glover acknowledges to have taken bond of Henry Brooke for 6000 lbs. of tobacco. If difficulty arises to be settled by John Chew, JOHN HARLOW, Richard Lee and Augustine Warner, wit. Cuthbert Fenick.

April 14, 1646 Henry Brooke, merchant, makes over to (the name of Richard Glover crossed with stroke of pen) JOHN HARLOW his plantation, cattle etc., as security for a debt of 12,000 lbs. of tobacco and authorizes "my friend" Mr. Richard Glover after payment to possess himself of the estate, to secure payment of 6000 lbs. of tobacco due him and if Brooke does not pay him 18000 lbs. of tobacco to give him full possession of the estate, signed; Henry Brooke, wit. Cuthbert Fenick

Nov. 7, 1646 John Hunt ordered to be arrested at suit of JOHN HARLOW.

In 1678, John Smith was involved in a law suit with JOHN HARLOW. This was not Capt. John Smith.

This John Harlow may have been from Accomack since this Smith and Wm. Smith might have been connected or it may have been John Harlow of Warwick, who served in the House of Burgesses. The records do not indicate which one he is, but there is a tendency to believe he was from Warwick.

In 1649 a John Harlow was living at Wicomico, Gloucester.

In 1652 James Warradine received land in Charles City for bringing over a John Harlow.

There are records of six other Harlows who came over between 1650-65 and one who came in 1693. They were indentured servants who would work for seven years in Virginia as payment for passage and lodging. At the end of the seven years, they were to receive enough tools, supplies and land so they could start out on their own.

There was no permanent stigma attached to arriving this way. One of the signers of the Declaration of Independence came over under this system.

Because they came at about the same time, I would think they were related and came quite willingly. England, at the time had a very high unemployment rate, not to mention a civil war between the Puritans and Cavaliers.

It was pointed out earlier that Wm. Peake was brought by John Harlow of Accomack. The name Peake occurs in the following list;

It is not improbable that the Patrons, above, were not more fortunate friends or relatives. The colony gave each Patron 50 acres of land for person's passage they paid for.

It is unfortunate but in all but a few of the counties the first Harlows lived, the court and land records have been destroyed by fires or wars. The next link is the tithe record of 1704 which list Thomas Harlow of New Kent as having 240 acres of land. He is no doubt descended from one of the previous mentioned Harlows, but which one will forever be lost unless there are records in England to straighten it out(a very unlikely possibility).

Most of the records of the 1700's are also lost because the Harlows lived in New Kent, Hanover and Henrico. The first two counties' records are partially complete.

The records remaining indicate that in 1721 John, Thomas and Wm. Harlow lived where New Kent, Hanover and Henrico all intersect. In 1724 Thomas Harlow bought 400 acres around the Chickahominy Swamp. He left this land to his son George in his will in Goochland in 1754.

The St. John's Church Parish Register of Jan. 1st. 1735-36 land processioning lists Wm. Harlow's land as next to John Martin's land.

John Harlow died in Henrico in 1763 leaving an inventory and Wm. Harlow died in 1772 in Albermarle leaving a will. The exact relationship is not known, but from witnessing of land deeds of each other and subsequent generations there is no doubt that they were related somehow.

More than likely brothers since they died very closely to each other.

In 1741 Wm. Harlow attended a meeting at the Governor's House. In 1788, in Albermarle, Thomas Harlow Sr., Thomas Harlow Jr., and Nathan Harlow signed a petition in favor of the emission of paper money. There were many Harlows who fought in Virginia's Wars. Wm. Harlow's son, Joel, fought in the French and Indian War(1753-56). He received bounty land in Botetourt County for his services.

In the Revolutionary War(1776-81) Michael, George and John(all of whom went to Kentucky), Nathaniel and Joel fought.

The main occupation of most of the Harlow family, as with most Virginians at that time, was farming but they also ran stores and one Jesse Harlow was Captain of the ship "Success".

In 1768 Jesse carried merchandise from Accomack, Va. to Boston and Plymouth, Mass., which were important commercial centers. He was son of John Harlow of Henrico.

The tithe records and censuses of the following counties list other Harlow relations.

In 1747, in Goochland tithes, there are Thomas, Harry, Nan(Nathaniel) and Samuel.

In 1763 in Hanover, John Harlow owned 150 acres of land.

The 1790 census of Virginia was burned during the War of 1812 but the

1780 tax list give us the following names:

The three wills and the available land records link all of the above Harlows as coming from the same families. All Revolutionary War Pensions list the birth place as Hanover.

The three people who left wills and an inventory are John, Wm. and Thomas.

In Henrico 1763-Vol. 1 pg. 1879 Henrico Misc. Records, recorded July 8, 1762 is the inventory for John Harlow:

3 negroes; Hopper, Gibbe and Patti, 5 bedsteads, 2 horses, 17 head of cattle, 7 sheep, 36 hogs, 25 geese, 1 cross-cut saw, a cart and wheels, 1 pr. of hilliards, 2 chafts, 1 looking glass, old iron, 3 wedges, 3 axes, 3 grubbing hoes, some old tools, 9 casks, 2 pewter dishes, 5 basins, 5 plates, 7 earthen bowls, 1 jug, 2 mugs, 1 pr. tongs, 1 pan, 2 iron pots, table, 5 leather chairs, 1 box of iron, 1 spice mortar, 1 spinning wheel, 2 sides leather, 6 skins in vat, 1 pr. money scales and 1 iron spit.

In Henrico Jan. 26, 1802 John Harlow, son of above John Harlow left a will which gives his children as John, Maximillian, Judah Black(wife of Jonathan Black) and Mary Loving(wife of ? Loving) and granddaughter Susan Loving.

William Harlow of Albemarle gave much of his estate to his children as they reached 21, but he left a will which was executed in 1772 and his children were Temperance Barnett, Susannah Ford(wife of Henry Ford D.B. B pg. 55 Louisa, prior to 1755), Mary Mooney(wife of John Mooney-D.B. B pg. 55 Louisa), Elizabeth Harlow, John Harlow, Joel Harlow(he fought in the French and Indian War), Wm. Harlow and Nathaniel Harlow.

Nathaniel Harlow(son of Wm. Harlow above) left a land division in Albemarle. His wife was Frances and he lived part of the time in Amherst. In Albemarle(D.B. 13 pg. 352) his children rented land to Wm. Fitch. They were Margaret Johnson(wife of Richard Johnson), Thomas, Bartlett, Hezekiah, John, Tandy and Nathaniel.

There was another Nathaniel Harlow who lived in Fluvanna, but he married Elizabeth Gilbert in 1789 in Albemarle. The witness was George Priddy.

He received a military pension(s. 37,988) which gave the following information about himself and his service.

On June 22, 1818, at the age of 62, he applied for this pension. He stated that he entered the service in 1777 in a company commanded by Capt. Marks in the 9th regiment commanded by Col. Richard Matthews. He served as a soldier for 18 months and was then discharged. He then entered the service in a company commanded by Capt. Barks(dale) of the 1st regiment of Va. Line.

During this time Nathaniel became sick and was discharged, but joined again and served until the end of the War about ten more months and was discharged at the New Kent Court House, serving around five years and ten months altogether.

His family consists of a wife, age 56, a daughter age 25 and two sons, one 14 and one 16. A land deed in Fluvanna had Nathaniel and Elizabeth Harlow selling land to Abram. Shephard. His will was recorded in Fluvanna 1843-W.B. 12 o.s. pg. 521-22. His children and their marriages are as follows:

Thomas Harlow of Goochland left a will in 1754. He bought land in New Kent in 1724. This land was an original patent. His land was listed as next to John Harlow, near the Chickahominy Swamp and Ash Cake Road. He left this land to his sons, as follows:

James Harlow gets 200 acres in Hanover and is to take care of his mother, Elizabeth.

Thomas Harlow receives 100 acres in Goochland,
 Robert Harlow receives what is left over.

George Harlow receives 100 acres in Henrico,
 Wm. Harlow receives what is left over.

witnesses: Susannah Priddy, John Harlow and Mary Louorn, Robt. Priddy Jr.

The inventory includes four slaves and other items totalling over two hundred pounds(\$10,000).

The wording in the will seems to suggest that Thomas Harlow had been

married before or had more children than named, since he used the term, "other family". Most of the marriages for the family probably took place in the lower counties. The Douglas Register had the following:

Although; most Harlows I know of are Christian, Baptist or Methodist, there were two Harlaws listed as Episcopal Ministers:

1729 Andrew Harlaw in Caroline
 1741 John Harlaw in King and Queen

I am not sure of their relationship in the previous mentioned families, but there may have been a connection.

One positive connection is Thomas Harlow and his wife, Susannah, who bought land in Louisa in 1796, from Wm. and Elizabeth Hodges. He had previously been in Albermarle where Thomas and Susannah Harlow Jr. sold land to Thomas Harlow Sr.(This was son of Thomas Harlow of Goochland, who left will).

The land in Louisa was situated on Sycamore Fork of Camp Creek. In Hinshaw's QUAKER RECORDS OF VIRGINIA 1777 at Camp Creek, Thomas Harlow applied for admission to the Quaker Meeting House. This was mentioned passingly and it did not seem to influence subsequent generations. There were marriages with families who showed greater participation, such as the Crews family.

Shelton and Sarah B. Harlow had at least one son, Robert Harlow (b. 1830 d. after 1895). Robert Harlow was one of the founders of the Louisa Christian Church in 1851. He married Susan H. Atkins (b. 1832 d. ?) in 1854. Robert Harlow was drafted in the Civil War in 1864, but since he had a wife and family and owned no slaves, I am sure he was not a gungo rebel. After the war, he worked at Byrd Mill, served as postmaster and was a farmer. After being widowed, Robert married Ada V. Belvin on Oct. 10, 1895.

JOHN MARTIN HARLOW is a name which occurs first in Louisa Co. records when William Harlow Sr. sells 400 acres of land for five lbs. (Deed Book A pg. 443). This comes to about 50¢ an acre (1 lb. comes to about 40\$ today) which I think is a gift because the land was situated in a good section and even then should have been worth more. This Wm. was also the same one who left a will in Albermarle in 1772 and he included John Harlow but there was no middle initial. It could be that he had the first John M., by a first wife and the second by a second wife or it may be the same man.

The name reoccurs again over the next 100 years and seems to fluctuate between Fluvanna and Albemarle. In Fluvanna, John Martin Harlowe Sr. (b. 1781 d. 1864) m. Margaret Oliver, dau. of Wm. Oliver in 1816. They had the following children:

John M. Harlowe Jr. died in 1884 and left a will to his wife Julia and chdn; W.R., Richard, Walter and Jim Harlowe. This family uses the e on Harlow, although it is obvious that they are descended from the same people who did not add the e(see marriage records). In those days people more or less spelled their names to suit themselves since you didn't have 10,000 state and federal forms to fill out during your lifetime.
